## **DEATH OF CYCLIST ON ITCHEN BRIDGE**

Most members will be aware of the accident on the Itchen Bridge which left one cyclist dead and another seriously injured. The cyclist who died, Derek Witt was well known in the local cycling clubs and was an inspiration to many younger cyclists as the tributes to him testify. It is a sad loss for the local cycling community. It appears that a car travelling in the opposite direction crossed the carriageway and crashed into the cyclists; more details will be revealed if there is a trial, which seems likely, later in the year.

## **IMPROVEMENTS FOR CYCLISTS IN TEST VALLEY**

Earlier this year Test Valley Borough Council produced a draft cycle strategy and consulted with relevant groups. Southampton Cycling Campaign was not consulted but, having expressed an interest, a draft strategy was sent to us and we were given a further two weeks from the response deadline to comment. The area of interest to us is primarily Test Valley South – Romsey, Chilworth, Rownhams, Nursling, North Baddesley and surrounding areas; we have not commented on proposals for Test Valley North, which is essentially Andover and surrounding areas.

Many thanks to John Heath, who went through the draft strategy point by point and produced a very detailed response, and to Dilys and Mark Brummel who also added comments.

Vivien Messenger from Test Valley Council Planning Department kindly agreed to come to our September meeting so that we could discuss in detail some of the proposals. ## **CYCLING DEMONSTRATION TOWNS**

Earlier this year eleven further towns were added to the original five cycling demonstration towns: Blackpool, Cambridge, Chester, Colchester, Leighton/Linslade, Shrewsbury, Southend, Southport, Stoke, Woking and York. Sadly, Southampton was shortlisted but not selected at the final stage. We would be keen to know what Cycle England was looking for and how Southampton Cycling Campaign can help the City be successful if the opportunity should arise again. It is hoped that Dale will be able to shed some light on this at the October meeting.

The cycling demonstration towns all receive substantial funding to be used on measures to increase cycling as a form of transport (measured as % of journeys). The original demonstration towns have implemented a wide variety of schemes, information about which can be found at

## UPDATE ON THE STREETTREAD PROJECT

Some of you met Natalie of StreetTread Project in the spring and I thought to tell you what she and I have been up to this summer to date. StreetTread is a jointly funded by Sustrans, PCT and Council, to get people more active. Natalie employed my business CycleWise for various cycling events including in April, a two day scheme at Thornhill aimed at 5-16 yr olds - challenging range and we did have a 5yr old on stabilisers with a 6' 16yr old in one group. Planning ahead was the key as we suspected a full range of abilities and problems so planned a 15m diameter challenge course on grass playing fields with control skills taught beforehand on tarmac. Bike mechanics on site and a great time had by all but under attended sadly. In Sept, we have just started 3 courses of 6 weekly sessions for adults based at different locations and times around the city with bikes on site provided. An interesting mix of reasons amongst those who have responded and again a wide range of abilities from the terrified to able cyclist who needs company, it's the most rewarding job I have done and I see many openings ahead. If you have thought about becoming a National Standard instructor, do it and join CycleWise as Southampton needs you.
